Where is Your Confidence?

2 Peter 1:16-21

Big Idea: "Where is your confidence?" The challenge to us is to trust God's Word above all. The Bible isn't myth, but eyewitness testimony & fulfilled prophecy. Like a light in darkness, Scripture guides us. Don't drift in faith—anchor yourself in God's truth, not human opinion.

Opening Question:

Have you ever had an experience where you lost trust in someone or something? How did it affect you?

Discussion Questions:

Peter emphasizes that he and others were eyewitnesses to Jesus' majesty. Why is eyewitness testimony important for our faith?

The sermon mentioned several Old Testament prophecies fulfilled by Jesus. Which of these prophecies stands out to you and why?



How does Peter describe Scripture in verse 19? What does this imagery mean to you personally?

Why do you think it's significant that Scripture doesn't come from "someone's own interpretation" (v. 20)?

Pastor Tim mentioned that many biblical authors reveal their own weaknesses and sins. How does this contribute to the Bible's credibility?

What does it mean that men spoke from God "as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit" (v. 21)?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Commit to regular Bible reading this week, focusing on how it illuminates your daily life.
- 2. Share with a friend or family member one way the Bible has proven trustworthy in your experience.
- 3. When facing doubts or questions, practice turning to Scripture for guidance before seeking other sources.
- 4. Memorize 2 Timothy 3:16 as a reminder of Scripture's divine origin and purpose.

Lord, help us to put our full confidence in Your Word. When we have doubts or questions, draw us back to the truth of Scripture. May we continually grow in our trust of You and Your revealed will for our lives. Amen.
